

Day Centers

- meals:
- socialising/occupational activities;
- hygiene care;
- laundry;
- organised holidays

In addition to the services referred to in the previous paragraph, the Day Centre may promote the development of home meal delivery services, home care services and temporary accommodation.

Nursing Homes

- Food appropriate to residents' needs, in accordance with medical prescriptions;
- Personal hygiene care;
- Laundry;
- Hygiene of spaces;
- Socio-cultural, recreational and occupational activities aimed at contributing to a healthy relationship between residents and stimulating and maintaining their physical and mental abilities;
- Support in performing daily activities;
- Nursing care, as well as access to healthcare;
- Administration of medication, when prescribed.

Home Care Services

- Personal hygiene and comfort care;
- Home hygiene, strictly necessary for the nature of the care provided;
- Provision and support with meals, respecting medically prescribed diets;
- Laundry of the user's personal clothing;
- Entertainment and socialisation activities, namely entertainment, leisure, culture, purchase of goods and foodstuffs, payment of services, travel to community entities;
- Teleassistance


- Users (co-payment)

Some Conclusions ...

- The number of vacancies on Elderly Services only cover about 11,6% of the population over 65 years old;
- Home Care is the service with higher coverage, around 4,4%, following the Nursing Homes, about 4% and Day Centers with 2,4% of covering;
- Non-profit entities are the largest providers of services for the elderly in Portugal.
